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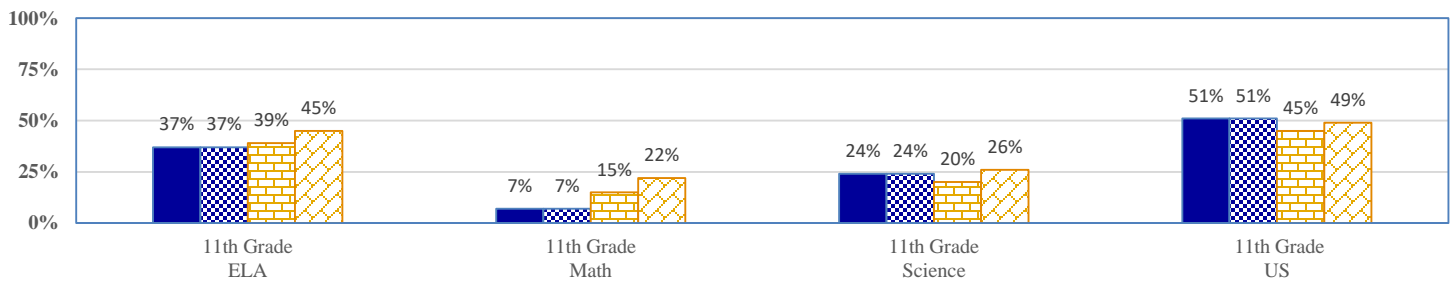
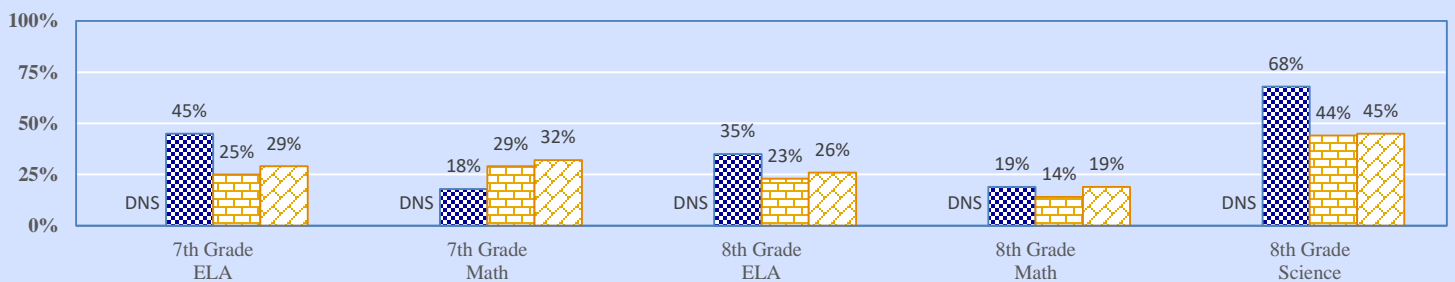
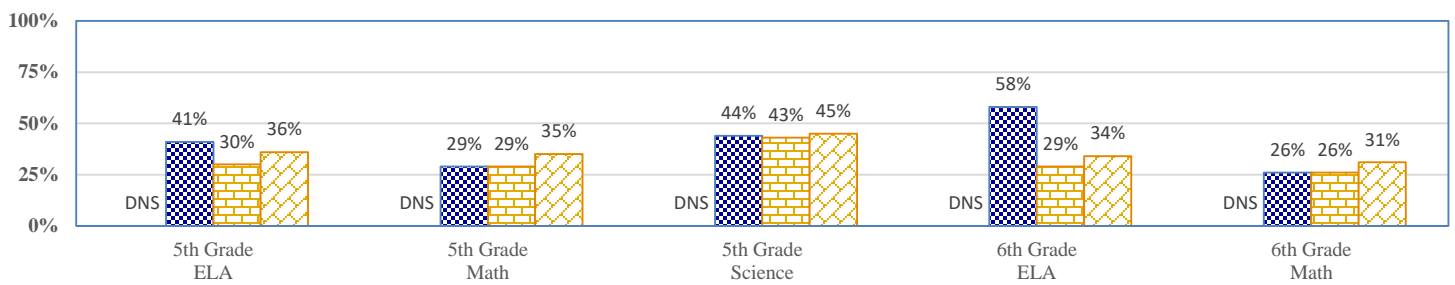
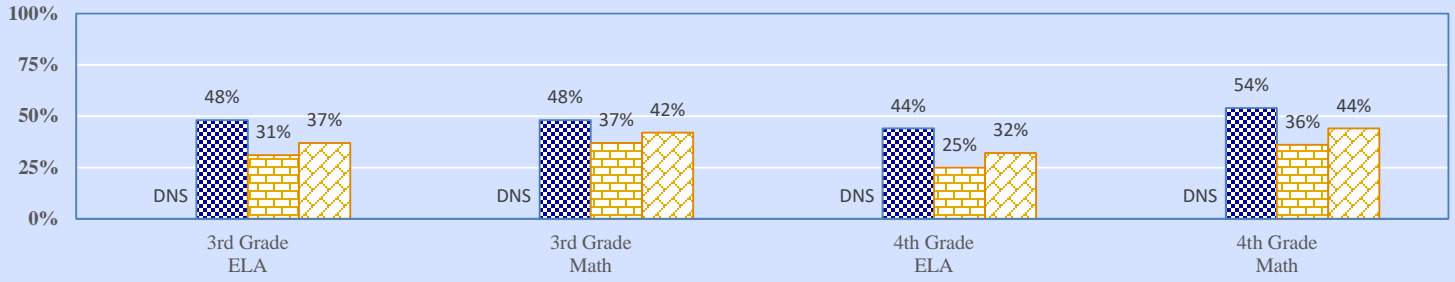
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**2022-23 Student Performance** (Regular Education Students, Full Academic Year at This Site)

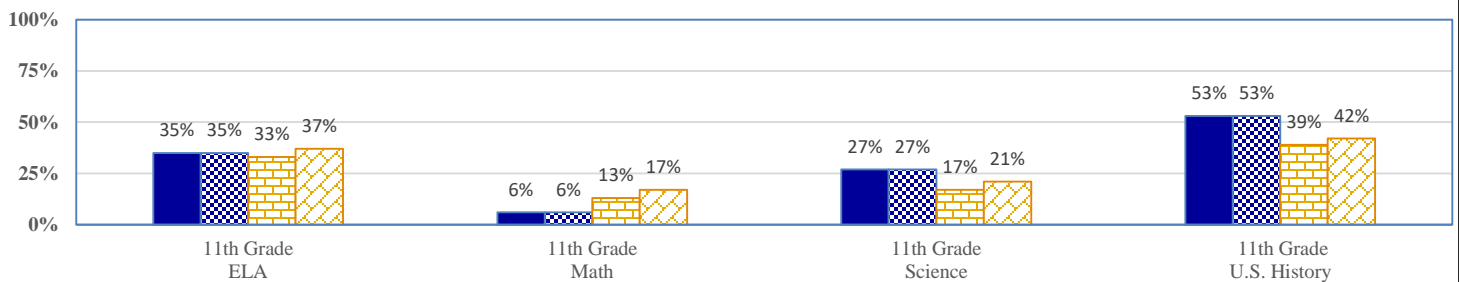
